




PVST started 2023 with a huge need for funding as we continue to grow and provide barrier-free ski education programs to youth. This community blew us away with their generosity!


Let's carry the momentum into 2024!

Income Total: \$456,000



Only 15% of the income comes through the ski education program registration fees, removing barriers to keep our ski education program accessible and inclusive.

Expenses Total: \$412,166



63% of expenses are for the youth ski education program.

We aim to make a difference and change the landscape of how athletics are viewed, and what can be achieved through its use. Our mission is to create equal access to opportunities and cater towards all of them. It is an investment into mental and physical health equity. One of the challenges for the organization is to create opportunities that match the development of everyone. The higher the individuals' needs and the more complex they are, the more difficult it is to meet them. It is easy to get stuck into a multitude of focuses. We recognize that the best way of serving most is to stay true to the bigger picture. This past year has been full of landmarks supporting that idea.

A strong focus has been on trails, the central amenity that our ski community revolves around. The trails support the largest diversity of interests. The better the trails, the better the experience, the bigger the draw to a larger community. Remembering back to one of the last days of 2023, I witnessed all those interactions at play. We had very minimal snow coverage, yet the quality of grooming was at an all-time high. Nearly all trails were open. We had several training groups taking advantage of it all. They had different goals, ranging from a national ski team member seeking valuable training ground, to supporters having a fun social time, to customers enjoying a novel experience. It was a great all-encompassing image.

A passion project is a never-ending endeavor. As we grow, so does the community and its participants. It leads to an increased feel of identity and to greater needs. Those needs need to be met with additional support. Only from there can we keep going. I do believe it is an avenue worth taking part in. - Come ski our two new beautiful BCT sections and newly named, Rowdy Coyote trail!
- Mill Hill is sculpted and one-way.
- The whole system is wide enough for PB100 grooming.
- Maps and signage are updated.

- The trails are shaped to be groomable with the tiniest snowfall.

TEAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS



- We served 115 skiers with 53 volunteer coaches!
- Two new-to-PVNT vans were purchased! These vans allow us to get our skiers to and from school, races and the trails safely.
- Training sessions were increased and expanded to 10 a week during the summer/fall/winter across layers and into the Wenatchee valley at large.
- Skiers are more supported with tailored opportunity and increased ability to cross between layers.

- A stipend for the Head Devo coach will help PVNT retain quality coaching year after year.
- Little Shredders, our new preschool-age ski program was born in partnership with Mountain Sprouts.
- PVNT was ranked the 11th club in the nation following the results of 2023 Junior Nationals in Fairbanks, AK.
- We celebrated PVNT's first National Champion, first alum invited to the US Ski Team and 6 All American skiers (ranked top 10 in the nation).
